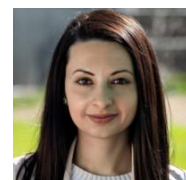

Clarendon Netball Court re-coating

The following information has been provided by City Operations Division staff regarding the Clarendon Tennis Club court resurfacing. I can advise this matter has been investigated.

The court recoating at Clarendon is currently allocated in PCW for the 2022-23 financial year, subject to the budget approval process.

Please note that the court recoating schedule can be subject to change based on the outcomes of annual condition audits which are currently being undertaken. Should these audits determine that recoating timings need to be change, then allocations within PCW will be adjusted accordingly and impacted clubs notified of any changes.

As requested, please find below confirmation of the allocation to the changeroom project and information on past master planning for the Happy Valley Sports Park.

- Project Funding Allocation

The Happy Valley Sports Complex Unisex Change Room project is included in Council's 10 Year Sports Assets Work Plan (SAWP) and Project and Capital Works (PCW) Program.

- Design in 2024/25 – \$20k





- Construction in 2025/26 construct – \$500k

The construction allocation allows for minor building expansion to accommodate for the SANFL guidelines if required.

This is not an endorsed budget, and as discussed at our meeting, amounts and timing are subject to change. I confirm that we are in the pre-planning phase, and design in earnest will not occur at this point.

- Master Planning

The site underwent a master plan many years ago with that being implemented in a staged approach. I will forward you a copy of the full report (prepared in 2006), however attached is an extract with stage 3 works highlighted. The value in undertaking further master planning is questionable. However a review of the previous planning and infrastructure delivered, and pulling together the future needs is worth considering.

Recycling facility	<p>Prime Minister Scott Morrison (ScoMo) joined us at Seaford Heights to announce a \$5.35 million federal government funding boost towards our new recycling facility, due to open later this year!</p> <p>The Southern Materials Recovery Facility (SMRF) is a joint initiative of City of Onkaparinga, City of Marion and City of Holdfast Bay (through our subsidiary the Southern Region Waste Resource Authority), and Australian recycling and resource recovery specialist, Re.Group.</p> <p>Once operational, the state-of-the-art facility will process at least 31,000 tonnes of yellow bin recyclables each year, with the capacity to handle more than 60,000 tonnes—helping to create a more resilient recycling sector in South Australia.</p> <p>It also has the capacity to convert recycled glass into sand for councils to use in civil and road construction works.</p> <p>Find out more in #OnkaparingaNow </p> <p>https://www.onkaparinganow.com/.../seaford-heights.../</p>
