Clarendon Branch of the Agricultural Bureau

The Clarendon Branch the Agricultural Bureau February 2023 meeting speaker was me on the subject of applying for Probate through the Courts SA website. I began by explaining that the process is very difficult even though in September 2022 the process was simplified. Unfortunately, the change has left a substantial number of obsolete documents on the Courts SA website. I explained that the application can now be made via the Courts SA website where you register yourself as the Decease's Executor and choose a password to access the Probate Application website. The Probate website enables you to enter all relevant details of the deceased and their property, motor vehicle and other possession including a fixed and/or notional value of those items. The website also enables you to upload a copy of the deceased Will and a copy of the Death Certificate. On completion of entering the required data you are then required to pay by credit card the probate fee then you are also required to access a cover sheet form that is required to be printed at the end of the process. To complete the process put the original JP Certified deceased Will and a certified copy of the Death Certificate in a "White A4 Envelope" and staple the cover sheet to the envelope and hand deliver this to the Probate Office in the Samuel Way Building Victoria Square. If all the above appears too hard then engage a Lawyer to do the whole process on your behalf at a cost to you.




Clarendon Primary School

Green Adelaide Grant

Clarendon Primary school won an amazing grant from Green Adelaide. Through the grant we will be engaging in environmental education at our site which includes identifying and removing woody weeds, like ash trees, from our outlined revegetation areas. We aren't doing this alone and will get support from Balanced Habitats to get these weeds out safely. They have sourced 150 local native plants that are suitable to our area, reflecting what was here before us and promoting habitat for our local insect and bird species. Balanced Habitats will also help support our planting day, where the community and local kindy have been invited to help us place the tube stock in the ground to ensure maximum survival.

This also involves us connecting with the local community. We will be attending Warriparinga with the kindy to go on a cultural and history tour to assist us in understanding the strong connection the Kaurna people have with our site, as well as the importance of responsibly planting in our environment. There will be a Welcome to Country to open our revegetation sites, to thank volunteers and our local community for their efforts. To further our connection to community and help increase the understanding of Kaurna culture in our local area, we will be hosting two cultural awareness training nights which will be open to our wider community. The aim of all of this is to have our revegetation efforts include acknowledgement of Kaurna custodianship over land, and share knowledge of land management techniques by starting conversations in our school and wider community. We will let the community know as soon as we have some dates for our community engagement events.





Hello from Clarendon CFS

Incidents in January/February

Nothing significant in our area but we did send our small truck to support the Montacute fire and we also sent one of our members to Pt Lincoln to help there as well.

Despite the end of summer dawning on us – fire season doesn't end until the end of April – please don't be complacent. Take every fire ban day seriously and always put your fire plan in place the night before.

What does the Clarendon CFS do to prepare when we know a bad day is comina?

The first thing we do is start hydrating ourselves. A good guide as a minimum and if we were doing nothing at all_is 1ml/kg/hr. If you weigh 80kg – you would need to drink a minimum of 80x24 – so almost 2 litres of fluid just to meet the basic needs of the body. When we are firefighting we are told to drink 1 litre per hour!!. We also have regular snacks of glucose or high carbohydrate source such as muesli bars when we are working.

We will also have regular snacks throughout the day. We may be on 'active standby' at the station – not always though. This means that we would have a crew at the station, dressed and ready to go. Our equipment (including our trucks) is checked every week to make sure it works on the day. We have our pagers, and we have an 'app' that tells us who is able to respond on the day.

If you plan to stay and defend your home -you need to ask yourself if you are really ready. What do I do to prepare?

Is your house defendable? The CFS website 'prepare for a fire' will tell you what you need to do.

From a physical aspect – start hydrating as soon as you get up. Have a good breakfast. Make sure you have light clothing that covers your entire body including goggles, mask and hat. Sounds crazy to wear all of this on a really hot day – but look at what we wear – it is for a reason!

You are always welcome!

We are always there every Monday night except public holidays from 6.30pm. You are always welcome to see what we do and learn valuable skills to protect yourself, your family, your pets and property.

Fundraising

We continue to be very grateful to have the opportunity to participate in our wonderful local Op Shop. This has generated an income that we have never had before. So far, we have purchased a printer, a large colour TV for the training room, some additional hand tools that are not standard stowage. Other plans for this money include providing a polo shirt and jacket for our newer members that we have been fortunate enough to welcome into our brigade. This money also provides for other niceties like biscuits for coffee and ice-creams and ice blocks and the occasional sausage sizzle for team building.
