Clarendon War Memorial Maintenance

An officer has attended the War memorial gardens and found that the plants referred to were in the front of the hall.

These lavenders were not dead and had recently received pruning works to tidy them up prior to Anzac Day. During the same maintenance service, the rosemary and roses in the War memorial gardens were also pruned and dead headed. A further service is programmed prior to Anzac Day to ensure they in a clean and tidy condition.
