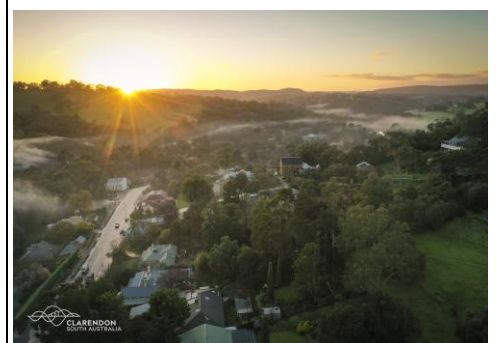


## Clarendon Primary School

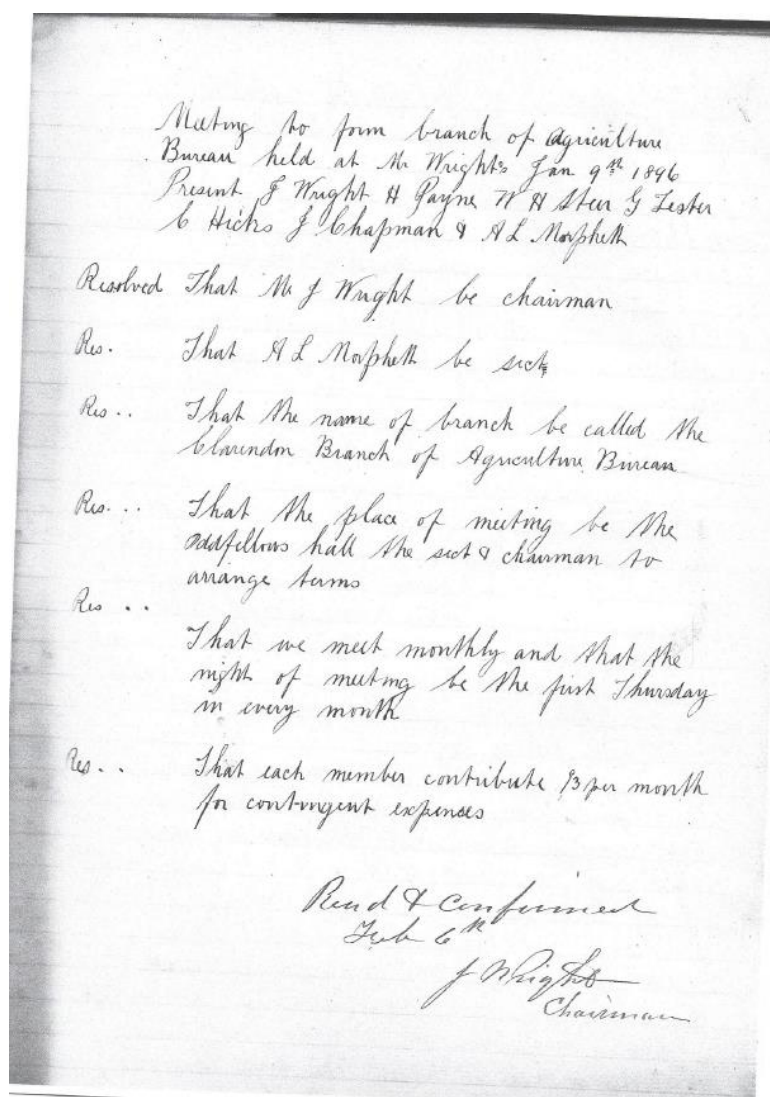


## Clarendon Agricultural Bureau News

The Clarendon Branch the Agricultural Bureau July 2022 meeting was about the history of the Clarendon Branch of the Agricultural Bureau. Extracts were read out from the first meeting minutes of the Clarendon Branch held on 9<sup>th</sup> January 1896 where it was resolved that Mr J Wright be chairman and A L Morphett be vice-chairman, the bureau name be Clarendon Branch of the Agricultural Bureau, the monthly meetings to be held in the Oddfellows Hall on first Thursday of the month and that each member contribute 3 pence per month for contingent expenses.

In the minutes there is a form that each Clarendon Branch member was to sign; the membership form stated that the branch members were not to use the Bureau meetings to discuss religion and/or politics.

The July 2022 meeting was concluded with several volumes of minutes being tabled to enable attending members to read the Clarendon Branch wide range of historical minutes.
