It has been announced that councillor candidate for the Pimpala Ward supplementary election Kim Davis has been elected to this role and I would like to congratulate her on her success. She will be appointed to this role at the 18 June Council meeting.

Projects Update

It has been a very busy couple of months on the projects front, with plenty of new and upgraded facilities and trails being delivered to the community, and others close to being delivered or just beginning.

In Aldinga, we recently celebrated the official opening of the first stage of a major long-term vision to redevelop Aldinga Sports Park, which included a new hockey building, soccer clubroom and changerooms, football/cricket changerooms, upgraded netball courts and an irrigated turf senior-sized soccer pitch.

In Flagstaff Hill, a new shared-use path at Minkarra Park recently opened, connecting two much-loved trails and reserves for the first time and creating an uninterrupted trail from Black Road to Chandlers Hill Road.

In Port Noarlunga, stage one of a major project to revitalise the Wearing Street aquatics precinct was officially opened, delivering modern facilities for the Onkaparinga Canoe Club, Easy Kayaks, South Port Surf Life Saving Club and Department for Education's water safety program, which offers aquatics and water-safety training to thousands of students each year. Tessa our Dalmatian managed to attend this event along with my wife Sue, with Tessa getting a lot of attention. When she meets people, she has a tendency to smile, and if there is food around up will come the paw for a shake, hoping to get a morsal in return.

All these projects were delivered thanks to significant amounts of state and/or federal government funding on top of the council's contributions. Securing funding in this way is a fantastic way for us to bring forward key projects for the community while delivering better outcomes for ratepayers.

Another important one we have just started – thanks to \$5 million from the Australian Government – is a five-year project to restore 5.3 kilometres of once-degraded waterways in Happy Valley, O'Halloran Hill, Reynella East, Old Reynella and Woodcroft.

The Urban Creek Resilience and Recovery Project will combat the detrimental effects of urban development, including pollution, erosion, silt deposits and loss of native vegetation.

Technical experts, Traditional Owners and community members will work together to restore Panalatinga Creek, Serpentine Creek and associated tributaries, which serve as integral parts of the Field River catchment and an important habitat for several threatened species.

Over the next five years, the project will encompass a range of activities, from weed removal and debris clean-up to infrastructure enhancements and native revegetation, with many opportunities for people to get outside and involved with the project.

Improving the health and functionality of these watercourses promises a host of benefits, from providing better habitats for local flora and fauna to creating inviting spaces for community interaction with nature.

Aberfoyle Hub Library Lift Update

Work to deliver a new lift as part of disability access improvements to the Aberfoyle Park Library and Customer Service is continuing and staff recently provided the following update.

The new stairs, handrails and external lighting is now complete and expected to be opened to the public within the next couple of weeks. Frustratingly for staff and the public, the lift continues to be delayed with minor, but critical works still to be completed before the lift can be safely commissioned for public use. The builder has provided a revised completion date of the end of June. This is extremely frustrating and staff sincerely apologise for the continued delays.

This project is being delivered by Council with funding support from the State Government following an election commitment from Member for Davenport Erin Thompson.

Coastal Adaptation Plan

The City of Onkaparinga recently celebrated another environmental milestone in our city with the release of our new seven-year Coastal Adaptation Plan. The plan details what we'll do from 2024–30 to anticipate and respond to risks to our coast arising from climate change and sea-level rise. It's

about being on the front foot, working with the evidence, and choosing options that are cost-effective, appropriate and mindful of community expectations.

In particular, the plan focusses on the risks of erosion and inundation (flooding) that we anticipate will result from climate change, with a greater focus on erosion. Earlier studies, including our 2021 Coastal Adaptation Study, found erosion poses a higher risk than inundation because most of our coastline is elevated. Importantly, the studies show the main threat is to public assets, because most private assets are set behind public roads.

The plan's release is yet another step in our ongoing journey of adaptation that will take place over the coming years, decades and even centuries.

We are already undertaken a range of activities to support coastal adaptation, such as replenishing dunes, managing outlet flows from rivers and creeks, revegetating cliffs, installing sandbag groynes, and building sea walls. The new plan outlines 25 additional actions, some of which are already underway.

Thank you to everyone in the community that provided feedback along the way, from the 2021 study, through to the initial release of our draft plan. Your input and local knowledge has been invaluable for us to understand community priorities when it comes to Onkaparinga's coastline.

The new plan was unveiled at the 2024 Australian Coastal Councils Conference, which we hosted in McLaren Vale during the last week of May, bringing together scientific experts, politicians and coastal local government leaders from across Australia to discuss practical ways to plan for and manage key coastal challenges.

Rainbow Rights in Action Forum

This free forum will launch our new online toolkit to help the LGBTI+ community exercise their rights over a lifetime. The toolkit will also help build awareness amongst the people who will be part of their choices, supports and care.

Annual Business Plan and Budget Update

Community engagement on the draft Annual Business Plan (ABP) and Budget for 2024 -25 closed on 13 May. Thank you to everyone that provided their feedback, which was considered by Council at an elected member session on 22 May. The adoption of the final Annual Business Plan and Budget will take place at a Special Council meeting on Tuesday 25 June.

The focus of this year's draft plan is budget repair and returning to a balanced budget as soon as possible. This will put us on track to keep delivering the services, programs and projects that support the city into the future. Council has carefully developed this draft budget to balance the tough financial decisions with impact on community members. We remain committed to providing hardship support for those who need it most.

Notification Olive Pile Burning Salvador Road Reserve Flagstaff Hill

Council is continuing to undertake extensive feral olive control to reduce fuel loads and improve the biodiversity value of the adjacent Salvador Road Reserve and creek-line. Declared feral olives have been treated within the area that are inaccessible to machinery and some of the treated olives have been cut and stacked into piles. These small piles of olives will now be burned to further reduce fuel loads, as they have done in the past.

Burning will be undertaken by experienced environmental contractors in accordance with CFS Vegetation Pile Burning Code of Practice and permit obtained from our Bushfire Prevention Officer. Burning is expected to occur in June 2024, excluding weekends. The burn will only occur in suitable weather conditions, between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30pm and a notification letter will be delivered two days prior to the suitable burn dates. The burn areas will be carefully extinguished and raked out at the end of each workday. During burning, it is advisable that clothes are not placed on the clothesline, to keep windows closed and remove nearby flammable material.

This work is part of the council wide Bushfire Preparedness Project which is funded by the Australian Government and aims to reduce fuel loads in high bushfire risk locations. For further information please contact customer relations on 83834 0666 or mail@onkaparinga.sa.gov.au

Graffiti Flagstaff Hill Aberfoyle Park

Unfortunately, someone has been graffitiing infrastructure (bus stop shades, fences, road signs) along Black Road, Sunnymeade Road and Happy Valley Drive. They even damaged the western parameter fence of the oval to the Thiele Primary School, Pilgrim School and School of the Nativity Campus Drive, Aberfoyle Park. There have been a couple of nights during May when this has occurred, and it appears to be late on a Thursday night or early on Friday morning. Council's volunteer anti-graffiti team have responded to these incidents and in most cases been able to remove it.

If you ever witness such an incident occurring, then I encourage you to report it to SAPOL on 131444 and safely capture it on your mobile phone to help identify the offenders. If you come across graffiti on such infrastructure after it occurs, then that can be reported to the City of Onkaparinga on mail@onkaparinga.sa.gov.au so that our team can respond and clean it up. Should you ever have CCTV or dashcam recordings of the offenders in action please save it and report to the police so they can follow-up as part of their investigation.
