The theme was South Australian artist Samuel Thomas Gill who produced a substantial number of sketches and paintings of South Australia around the 1850s.

Samuel's father managed the Coromandel Valley Post Office.



At an early age Samuel Gill sketched and painted scenes of the South Australian countryside and of the streets of Adelaide including a painting of Captain Sturt heading out of Adelaide to explore inland Australia.

Samuel Gill was also a member of the ill-fated John Horrock's expedition and painted landscapes of the South Australian bush during the expedition.

In addition to the display of Samuel Gill prints, recently discovered photos of Clarendon were also displayed. These photos were recently added to the State Library website.

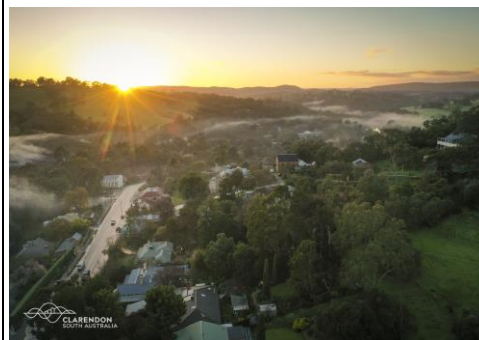
