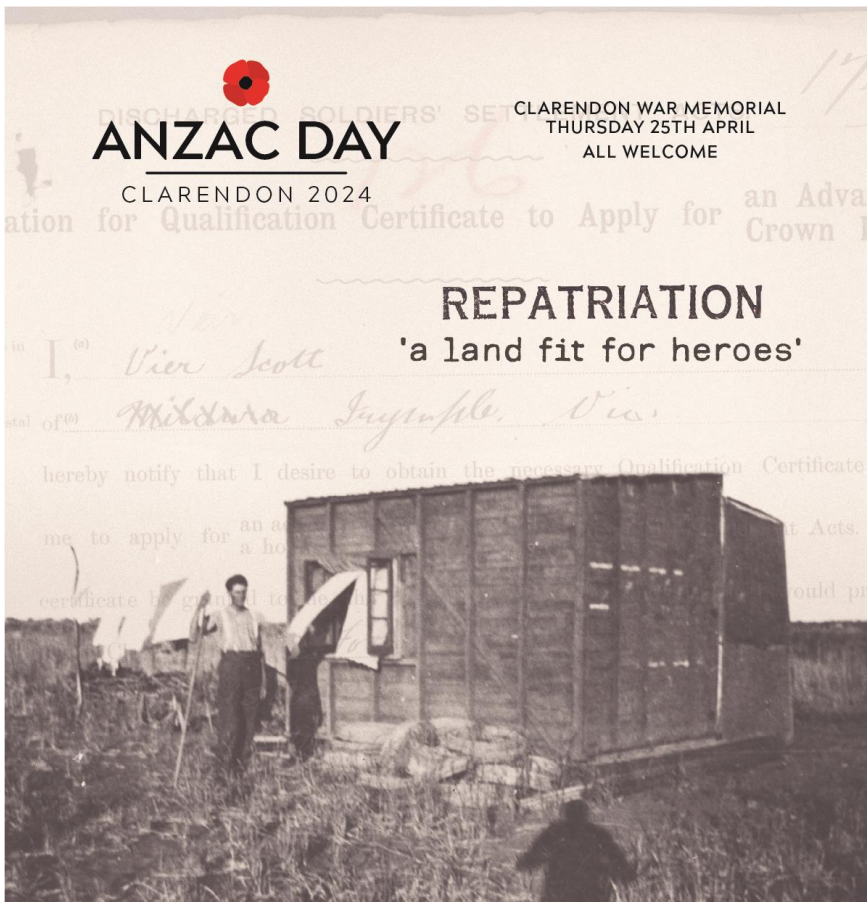

The run sheet for Anzac Day itself is as follows, and everyone is welcome...



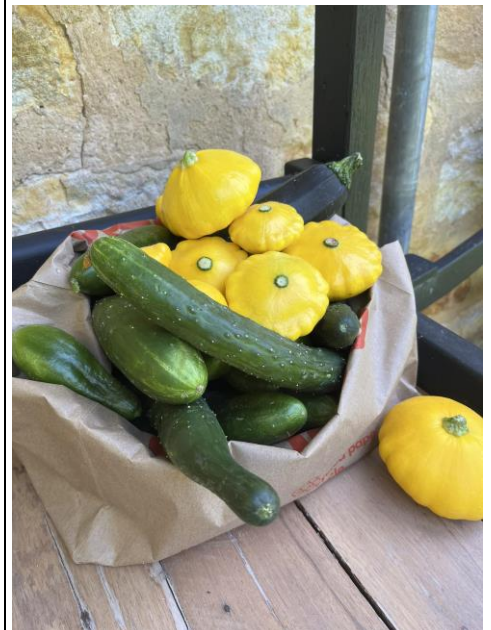
## Clarendon Community Lunch

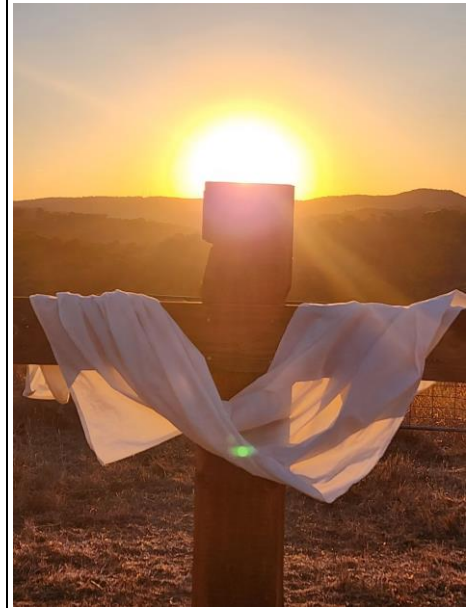

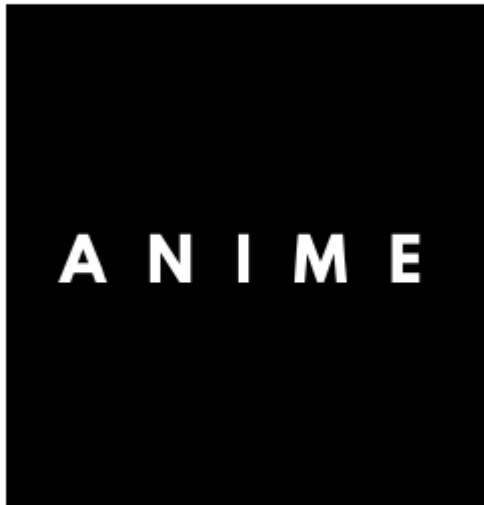
