Thank you to the community members who attended the Clarendon Community meeting last night at the lovely Hazel McKenzie Clubrooms. Many topics were covered with a summary below.

Topics discussed:

Clarendon Community Op Shop

- Sales this financial year = \$54,000
- Disbursements to community groups = \$52,000
- Currently 60 people volunteering thank you!
- The community unanimously agreed to remove the stage at the hall as it is in bad repair and the steps are not safe. A suggestion from the meeting was for the reclaimed wood (if suitable) to be recycled to make garden features/bird houses etc.

Update on the proposed Community Garden

• This is still work in progess with the Onkaparinga Council, Hazel McKenzie group and the Community Garden subcommittee. A few additional obstacles have been discovered including water pipes installed underground where the rain water tanks were going to be positioned. Further discussions will need to be held to ensure that the community garden is not responsible for any repairs required in the future.

Road safety issues

A community Automated External Defibrillator (AED)



In addition, we are planning on purchasing new whiteboards to replace our very outdated ones that just won't clean up!

Fire Season has concluded - Burning permits and fire management

Please be sure to check the council website or contact them personally to ensure you know which zone you are in and if you are able to burn without a permit after the 30th April. If you do fall into this category – please be sure to follow the burning requirements as some grounds are still very dry despite the cool and wet weather. This link will take to the Onkaparinga Council website and the map to show which zone you are in. **Look after your lungs and wear a mask that will reduce smoke particles.**

Burning in the open (outside of the fire danger season only)

To reduce bush-fire fuel, vegetation pile burning can be undertaken outside of the fire danger season within defined rural areas.

Burning must be undertaken in compliance with the CFS Vegetation pile burning code of practice **and** conditions on the issued permit.

You will need to abide by the following terms and conditions:

- Only burn dry, seasoned timber not treated or painted timber
- Not burn plastics, rubbish, oil, tyres, furniture or other household items
- Maintain a 4 metre clearance (minimum) of flammable material, around and above the burning pile
- Consider other options for waste disposal.

Search and select your property on the map to view requirements.

- 1. Find your address
 - Type your property address into the address search or zoom in to find your property.
- 2. Select your property
 - Click on your property to view the information. You will need to click on the area that is shaded either red, orange or green.
- Complete the online Burn Permit if required
 We recommend using Google Chrome. Map may not display with earlier
 versions of Internet Explorer.

If you are concerned about Road Safety in Clarendon please read on.....

At the Clarendon Resilience Committee Meeting on 9th April the issue of road safety was discussed in relation to recent traffic accidents and increasing dangerous driver behaviour particularly on Grants Gully Road within the 50kph zone.

It was agreed that it is important for individual residents to take action as described by the CCA Chairman in the April Newsletter. That is to report incidents of dangerous driving to SAPOL, write individually to raise concerns to local Federal and State MPs and the Council.

In addition it has been suggested that the community prepare a petition to bring to council who will advocate on our behalf to further our cause. The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) are responsible for Grants Gully Road. The petition will be presented to the Council Chamber to formally accept at a scheduled council meeting in the future.

Please sign so that we can make our voice be heard as a community for the safety of all those who use our roads.

The presentation concluded with plenty of questions on savings and what actions needs to be taken by individual.


