That's the question everyone's been asking and here's the answer.
A lot has happened. Things are about to really move.

First, we can be really proud of the tremendous effort in raising \$1,518. Yes, we have enough to buy the old Rechabites Hall free of encumbrance.

We are all grateful to the Rechabites for the generousity and assistance in making this Hall available for the people of Clarendon.

As you know, committees were formed to raise the money and draft the Constitution required to make the transfer legal. (Thanks to those citizens who have worked so hard for us.) To formalise the transfer we now need a public meeting to table and accept the proposed constitution. So make a note of this date:

Monday evening at 7.30

at the 'new' Clarendon Community Hall.

Put a big circle around this date on your calendar and don't miss it. We want a great roll up, particularly from those who have contributed to the initial purchase expenses. There'll be a light supper afterwards.

This Hall is for all of us.

Have no doubt about that ... we already use it for the Boy's Gym Club Friday evenings, music lessons are held Wednesdays for Primary school children. There are plans to make it available to the Pre-school kindergarten and spruce it up so we can earn an income from Weddings, Cabarets, etc. These new uses will require adequate conveniences and maintenance, so we'll need more funds. Here's the next date to remember:

The Clarendon Community Hall was bought and paid for by the people of Clarendon in 1972. Land was also part of the community purchase, and the community land extends from the end of the council carpark to the back of the hall and across the creek to the fence line.

In 1973 the Clarendon Kindergarten moved into the Community Hall and have been there ever since. This small but significant Kindergarten provides an important service to the families of Clarendon and Kangarilla as well as being the main conduit to the Clarendon Primary School. The hall and grounds are managed by the Clarendon Community Association who work hard to ensure the hall is maintained and preserved for the benefit of the whole community.


All of the maintenance, upgrades, cleaning, services and gardening jobs (possum removal) are all funded through the Clarendon Community Association. Fundraising efforts, disbursements from Op Shop, lease of the premises to the Dept Education and grants have been the main source of funds.

The landscaping works recently completed provides an aesthetically pleasing entrance to our beautiful old building and will add a usable outdoor space for more community events and community involvement. The upgraded car park will provide safer parking as well as safe drop off and pickup places for the kindergarten children.

The Clarendon Op Shop has been a huge success in this venue, providing financial benefits to our small community as well as connecting our groups and clubs.

We thank the community members who in 1972 had the foresight to see the benefits this hall would bring to our community.

Clarendon Emergency Preparation Project



Dear Clarendon Resident

Over the past few months, a group of locals have been working together under the leadership of Red Cross in partnership with the Onkaparinga Council to establish a Community-Led Emergency Resilience group. We have identified a number of actions that would enable our Clarendon community to be better prepared in cases of emergencies.

We have discussed many issues pertaining to possible emergencies that may arise for us locally and one of the actions is to establish a means of communication to all Clarendons residents.

As there are **no identified 'safe places' in Clarendon during a bushfire**, we want to ensure that everyone in our community has the means to identify, understand and manage their risks before and during fire season. To achieve this, we need to establish the best way for each resident to choose how they receive and obtain the information or support needed to prepare for the upcoming fire season.

The package that you will be receiving soon, contains important information to help you to prepare before and during fire season. **Ultimately it is up to each resident to decide how they wish to achieve**

What we would like to do is to establish a means of contact with everyone in our community either by phone, email or social media, solely for the purpose of ensuring people are prepared and informed, well in advance of (not during) a bushfire emergency.

There are 3 options:

- Keep the information in this package in a safe place and use the links and resources provided to prepare and manage your bushfire plan independently.
- 2. Reply to this email address clarendonsafe@gmail.com Let us know if there is further information or assistance that you still need. You can add your phone number if this is a better option for communicating with you. If you know of anyone who does not have access to electronic media or the physical means to leave early on a predicted bad fire weather day, please ask them to let us know via phone on 0423969817 so that we can have a plan for them in advance.

- The event, to be held at Morphett Vale's Wilfred Taylor Reserve from 10am to 2pm, is just one of <u>a range of events</u> being held during the school holidays (1-16 October), including the statewide <u>Nature Festival</u>, and at council's libraries, youth centres and community centres (details below).
- A variety of council vehicles will be on display at Trucks on Tour so children can see them up close and explore, meet the drivers and take photos. Trucks, tractors, mowers and crushers, to name a few, will be on display, along with some heroic emergency services vehicles.
- Every hour there will be a variety of vehicle demonstrations, showing what they're made of, while roving artists, live music and activities for children will also be part of the fun.
