

GoodSAM App - Sign-Up Now!


Have you heard of the GoodSAM (Good Smartphone Activated Medics) App? GoodSAM allows SA Ambulance Service to dispatch CPR trained first responders to attend people suffering a cardiac arrest so potentially life-saving CPR can be started prior to arrival of SAAS crews. You can register for GoodSAM through https://www.goodsamapp.org/saas, where you enter your contact details and upload evidence of your first aid training. It is then verified by SAAS, and then you become a GoodSAM responder.

Currently GoodSAM coverage around Clarendon looks quite sparse, with only myself and CFS members Charlie and Cain registered to respond (see map). It would be great to see Clarendon covered in GoodSAM responders!



Good afternoon,

The City of Onkaparinga is about to start shaping its new 10-year community plan and we'd love your input via our annual community <u>survey</u>.

We want to know what matters to you, how connected you feel to your community, how you stay active, your thoughts on the local economy and more.

The survey takes 10 minutes to complete and is open until Sunday 5 November.

During the community engagement period we're also asking the community what their vision for the region's future is. The questionnaire is available at council offices, libraries, community and youth centres, recreation centres, and selected events.

Responses from the survey and vision questionnaire will also be used to inform reviews of two other key strategic documents—the council's Long Term Financial Plan, which guides long-term financial sustainability; and Strategic Asset Management Plan, which helps ensure appropriate infrastructure is in place for current and future generations.

The three draft plans are scheduled to be released for community engagement in April 2024.

We're keen to involve residents of all ages in the survey and vision questionnaire. We'd appreciate if you can help spread the word to your family, friends, neighbours and networks.
