

# Clarendon Kindergarten

#### Science Week

From a very young age, children are naturally curious and inquisitive about the world around them. Scientific exploration allows children to explore, inquire, problem solve, cooperate and communicate with others.

Clarendon Kindergarten recently celebrated Science Week with the children conducting a variety of experiments. We made goop slime using cornflour and water and experimented with its consistency. We discovered that if you handle it quickly, it becomes a solid, but if you handle it slowly, the goop turns to a liquid right in your hands!

The children set up a string race track between chairs and raced balloon rockets! These were powered by air and gave us the opportunity to experiment with testing varying amounts of air inside the balloons to manipulate the speed and distance we could make the balloon travel.

We conducted an experiment that made dancing rainbows on milk! Some very unusual things happen when you mix milk, food colouring, and a drop of liquid soap. We began to investigate how fats and water separate. We also created our own hypothesis and observed what might happen when we placed gummi bear lollies into cups of varying amounts of water. Will they grow? Shrink? Change colour? We explored the concept of floating and sinking with some inspiration from the story, "Who Sank the Boat?" and even made our own bubble wands with varying items, including our hands!

Research tells us that children naturally engage with scientific concepts and processes in their play as they explore their world. Science Week provided a wonderful opportunity to not only learn through play but gave further opportunities to support investigation and experimentation, and to stimulate wonder and collaboration amongst the children.











# **Clarendon Primary School**

Here at Clarendon Primary School, we celebrated Book Week recently and incorporated it with our annual Elders' Day, PLUS a bake-off. It was a busy but fun-filled day which kicked off in the morning with a dress up parade in our library – we were enthused to see some of the special elders dress up for the occasion too. After the parade, students showed their special guests around their classrooms and the school, and some even got to join in with the Year 3-4 Class in their regular Kitchen Garden lesson.





The bake-off was a great success thanks to the hard work of our fundraising captain, student Hannah, and her mum Toni; we plan to make it an annual event. There was a category for each class, and one for adults...our Principal Regan Birrell won the adult category, but we promise it wasn't rigged! We would like to give a big thank you to the locals who agreed to be our judges: Steph McLeod and Helen Ashenden (pictured), for their expert tasting skills and impartiality.



Our Year 3-4 Class enjoyed their camp to Mylor a few weeks ago. One of the favourite activities was big swing. One person is harnessed up while the remaining people form a line and work together to hoist them into the air. The person in the air then pulls a rip cord to release themselves and enjoy the drop of their lives. Staff were excited that they also got to join in the fun.

Meanwhile, the Year 5-6 Class ventured to the zoo for a day trip recently, splintering off into small groups with a staff or parent helper, for an Amazing Race (put together by student teacher Jayde, who also happened to turn 21 on the day!). The kids used a map with co-ordinates to make their way to different exhibits, then answered questions specific to the animal at that location. It was a different and exciting way to see the zoo and everyone managed to see most, if not all, of the exhibits.



# News from Josh Teague MP Member for Heysen

Spring is upon us and it's a beautiful time to be in Clarendon. While we are all enjoying the lush greenery and warmer days, hints of summer in the air are a timely reminder to prepare for the upcoming fire season. Clarendon CFS, who do fantastic work all year round, recently shared that hot and dry conditions are predicted for this year's Fire Danger Season. Now is the time to create and practise your Bushfire Survival Plans – as well as prepare your property. Here's some tips recommended by the CFS in Spring to reduce the amount of vegetation on your property:

- Slash or mow long grass and remove cut material
- Remove weeds.
- Cut back trees overhanging your home.
- Remove fallen branches and other debris such as bark, heavy mulch, wood piles.
- Remove leaves from gutters.
- Check and service all mechanical equipment, including grass cutters, water pumps, sprinkler systems and fire extinguishers.
- Prepare / check your emergency kit.

Visit <u>www.cfs.sa.gov.au</u> for more. Bushfire preparedness, action and response is a vital issue for Hills residents; not only reflected by those of you who volunteer with Clarendon CFS but in the range of matters raised with me by constituents throughout the year. Key themes of issues often raised with me that are integral to bushfire preparedness include protecting our local environment, weed control, and the state and safety of local roads. My team and I have helped hundreds of individual constituents and have already had a number of local wins. I'm here to help, so as always, please don't hesitate to contact me to share your views or seek information.


