Going well and no issues, Gavin wondered if we cap the disbursements for December to \$1000 per group. Over a 12-month period this potentially could be \$4000 for each group. Feedback received from some of the groups about how they have used their funds: Kindy have purchased a phone for excursions etc and also plants, the Over 50's club are subsidising local community groups to use the clubrooms at a cheaper rate, the tennis club used the funds to recruit players, the Church are passing their disbursements along as donations to other group (mental health etc), School has provided yoga to all children at no extra cost to families. The committee is extremely happy to see these funds being paid forward.



The Rosters are nearly full for November and December. Gavin is going to follow up with school community as there has not been a lot of support from them.

- a. Community events
  - Spring Fair feedback. We were concerned that having the Meadows Fair on the same day would reduce the numbers of people attending. However, this did not happen and there were lots of feedback from people made a day of it and went to both fairs. Such great feedback from everyone. Good attendance and a relaxing day on the lawn! The Bake Off went really well. Quite a few people baked, and Muriel's family are happy to stay involved. Will definitely run this event again next year. All prize winning food was sold on the kindy stall.
    - Gavin spoke about increasing the site fees next year. Some discussion that there should be a discount for local people however. Brad and Gavin are looking at booking and paying in advance online. Once paid the site fees would be non-refundable. Gavin & Brad are keen to involve children more and will do some promotion for that as well.

b. Community Gardens - thanks Louise

The feasibility study has begun and presented to the council. They have asked Louise if she would like to speak to a subcommittee at the council about this new venture. Beau from Barefoot Creative has been asked to come out to speak to the group. There is a lot of interest within the community however it is early days and there is a lot of work ahead.

c. Hall maintenance – All State Pest Control have been in to remove possums and secure the hall

### 5. Any other business for discussion

- a. Hall Maintenance Funding agreement sent in July was lost in cyberspace. Now received and completed. Funding this year is \$6443.04
- b. Tomato Preserving Day discussion

Thank you to Steph for sending in your plans for this day. The committee think it's a great idea and are happy to support it. For this first event however it is recommended that it starts with a pilot, keep it simple, borrow equipment, people bring their own sterilised jars (or Louise is happy to ensure all jars are sterilised correctly). It is a community day and numbers will need to be capped. Mark suggested a fund of \$200 for purchasing consumables. Steph to provide a list of items for participants to bring. As numbers will be capped it will be ticketed and paid event. The committee are all in favour of supporting this event with a float of \$200. Gavin will speak to Steph about this.

- c. Repairing broken wooden borders along creek line
  - During the Spring Fair one of the posts rolled off with someone sitting on them falling down the embankment. These all need to be checked and repaired for safety reasons. Helen suggested that they be replaced with bench seating however the cost is quite expensive.
  - Trevor moved that all these posts get repaired and secured properly now and we will discuss with the community about what we could do going forward.
- d. A suggestion from the recent survey was for community yoga sessions to be held at Riverbend Park.
   Gavin has spoken to Shoba who is free 4<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> December. Committee support this idea. Petrah will advertise. Gavin will confirm. Cost is \$80 per session and the project fund will pay.
- e. Do we need to promote the CCA at community events? A discussion held that this stall was not well represented and maybe the spring fair was not the right event to promote the CCA.
- f. Community dinner will be scheduled for late January thank you Petrah
- g. Apple & pear cider crush will be scheduled for next year as well.
