Vale James (Jim) Trueman

21 November 1930 – 10 July 2025

Jim Trueman was born in the Clarendon Hospital in November 1930 and spent most of his life living on the family farm in Angel Gully. He went to Clarendon Primary School and attended high school at Unley High. In 1955 he married Fae (nee Lowe) and built a new house on the property. Together they raised two children David and Fiona.

In 1963 he joined the Clarendon Emergency Fire Service and served nearly 30 years. He held roles as Fire Control Officer and Brigade Lieutenant and served as President of the Management Committee almost continuously.

Jim was involved in 28 different Clarendon community groups, from the Agriculture Bureau to the Lions Club, where he was honoured internationally for humanitarian services. He was awarded the National Commonwealth Medal for community service and received a Citizen of the year Award from the Happy Valley Council.

Jim and Fae travelled extensively overseas, including China and Russia, in the late 1970s and when Jim retired from Telecom extensively throughout Australia.

In 1998 they moved to Blackwood but maintained a connection to Clarendon through the family farm.

In their later years they were very involved with Friends of Belair National Park, Friends of Onkaparinga and Friends of Private Bushland and were acknowledged for their contribution with life membership.

In April this year they celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary.

A life not just long but deeply lived.




