- Gardening magazines, worm tea, jars and pots.


Definitely NO:



Katie and Adam hosted this month's garden club at their lovely home. Adam spoke to the group about how to make organic fertilisers, microbial solutions as well as plant supplements. All managed easily from what we have at home and great for the gardens and environment.

We learnt a lot from Adam's research and lived experiences – thank you for sharing this with us.

Easy Homemade Microbial Solution

Ingredients

- Cooked Potato
- Leaf Mold Soil
- Sea Salt

Recipe

- Fill a bucket with water
- Put potato, handful of leaf-mold soil, and sea salt into paint strainer
- Mash the potato and soil by hand and steep the bag in the bucket
- Cover and wait for foaming

Dilution

Duration of Brew	Dilution Rate
Soil Drench	N/A
Plants in-ground/Foliar	1:10 (1 Pint in 2-Gallon Watering Can)
Seed Starting	1:1000 (1 Teaspoon in 2-Gallon Watering Can)

CFS News

The question has again been brought to the attention of the Clarendon Community Association about why the CFS sirens are not sounded when there are fire incidents in or near to our town.

I found information that Sue shared with the community last year about this issue, with a reminder to always be prepared for any fire hazards during the summer months.

"My main concern is that the community is relying on the siren as their only means of being notified that there is a fire in our area. I cannot stress enough that you must have a bushfire plan that factors in the possibility that you may get no warnings at all. Embers can spread from other fires that are occurring many kilometres away and be on our back doorstep before any of us are aware. I cannot stress enough that our precious community must stay alert and vigilant."

Fires can threaten suddenly and without warning.

You need to be prepared to enact your Bushfire Survival Plan without receiving any emergency warning.

You need to:

- know what the bushfire dangers are for your area
- know the daily [Fire Danger Rating](#) for your area
- watch for signs of fire, especially smoke and flames
- know what you need to do to act decisively the moment you know there is danger
- put your Bushfire Survival Plan into action (avoid a "wait and see" response).

Do not rely on a single source for emergency warning information.
