Adoption of the City of Onkaparinga Local Heritage Code Amendment



We are very happy to share that the Minister for Planning approved the City of Onkaparinga Local Heritage Code Amendment on 3 October 2025.

The following changes have been consolidated into the online Planning and Design Code and will be published on the Plan SA portal on 23 October 2025:

- Listing of 42 new local heritage places
- Delisting of 18 existing local heritage places
- Amendment to existing 24 local heritage places

This fantastic outcome is a result of over 5 years of work that included the first comprehensive review of all existing Local Heritage Places and Representative Buildings since the 1997 amalgamation (of the former Noarlunga, Willunga and Happy Valley councils), together with public nominations and engagement with the community at key milestones.

Santos Tour Downunder

In the new year, it is time to switch gears for some high-speed action with the City of Onkaparinga hosting two stages of the thrilling Santos Tour Down Under. Please come along and cheer on more than 240 elite cyclists from across the globe.

The women's race, [Ziptrak® Women's Stage 1](#), will start and finish in Willunga on Saturday 17 January. The 137km opening stage will pass through Port Willunga, McLaren Vale and Aldinga.

The men's event, [THINK! Road Safety Men's Stage 4](#), will follow on Saturday 24 January, with riders setting off from Brighton and racing toward the finish line at Willunga Hill.

The 176-kilometre route will travel through Flagstaff Hill, Coromandel Valley, Clarendon, Maslin Beach, Port Willunga and Aldinga. It'll be a triple treat for cyclists and spectators alike with riders taking on the notorious Willunga Hill three times for the first time, bringing the total ascent for the day to 2,572 metres.

The 2025 event marked the 25th anniversary of the Tour Down Under, drawing 807,900 fans across all stages, a record \$98 million in visitor spending, and \$62.5 million in value added to South Australia's economy. It also supported the equivalent of 488 full-time jobs, according to Deloitte Access Economics.

Re-opening Refurbished Hopgood Theatre

The Hopgood Theatre's officially reopened its doors in late October after its \$6 million transformation, ushering in a new era for the Southern Adelaide institution.

The theatre's top-to-toe refurbishment includes:

- a complete interior refresh with upgraded sound, lighting and acoustics
- improved bathroom facilities
- enhanced accessibility, including 10 new wheelchair and companion seating options
- a revitalised front-of-house and bar
- a new, intimate performance space for small-scale productions
- upgraded backstage facilities including green room and rehearsal spaces to support productions of all sizes
- a bold new visual identity.

The transformation was made possible thanks to a \$6 million grant from the state government, reflecting the value placed on this cultural icon and its role in bringing people together through performance.

Behind the scenes, the future of the theatre is secured. The City of Onkaparinga and Country Arts SA have finalised an agreement for Country Arts SA to continue managing theatre operations on behalf of the council for the next 3 years, with an option to extend through to 2031.

Reconciliation in the South

Everyone is invited to a free, family-friendly event in Ramsay Place, Noarlunga Centre on Wednesday 12 November (11am to 1pm) to celebrate Reconciliation.

The annual family friendly [Reconciliation in the South](#) event will feature a free sausage sizzle; live music and performances; art, craft and cultural activities; First Nations businesses and stalls; and more. All welcome – bring your family, friends and community spirit!

This event is about bringing the whole community together to better understand reconciliation and explore meaningful ways to move forward collectively in the City of Onkaparinga, while encouraging all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements; and consider how each of us can contribute to reconciliation in Australia.

Guided by the cultural principles of respect and contribution, this approach strengthens community relationships and benefits the nation as a whole.

The City of Onkaparinga does this by working with Elders, community and key stakeholders; Neporendi Aboriginal Forum Incorporated and Neporendi Aboriginal Community Centre staff and volunteers; and with the support of Joining Hands and Minds – a network of local agencies that provide services to the First Nations community.

The council also continues to support reconciliation through the delivery of its Reconciliation Action Plan and a range of actions across four key areas – relationships, respect, opportunities and governance.

The Reconciliation in the South event was rescheduled after the National Reconciliation Week-aligned event faced bad weather conditions in May.

Picking the Perfect Plant

Finding the right plants for your garden just got easier – thanks to the council's new native plant selector tool.

This easy-to-use online resource – available at onkaparingacity.com/nativeplants – is designed to guide users in selecting plants that are not only beautiful and suited to local conditions, but also beneficial for the environment.

More than just a gardening aid, the [native plant selector tool](#) responds to a growing demand for practical, locally relevant information on plants that support urban greening and biodiversity, and contribute to broader efforts to restore habitats.

The user-friendly tool enables users to:

- filter plants by height, colour, soil type, wildlife-attracting qualities, light requirements and flowering time
- learn about each plant's growing conditions and ecological benefits

- browse freely or use filters to narrow down the perfect plants.

The tool also includes information about low-flammability species, based on information from the Country Fire Service and a fire-wise project by the [Fleurieu Environment Centre's Firewise Project](#).

In developing the tool, the council worked with local gardening clubs and a specialist native landscaping contractor to ensure the information was useful, practical and accurate. Photos were sourced from staff and community members.

There are 180 species listed including trees, shrubs, herbs, wildflowers, climbers, groundcovers, ferns and grasses.

Plans are underway to add more local species to the tool, especially those that add value to residential and commercial landscapes.

If you're inspired to green your space with native species, the council is here to help. Residents may be eligible for a rebate of 50 per cent of the cost of plants, up to a maximum of \$50, when purchasing from participating native nurseries.

Sellicks Beach Growth Area Joint Amendment and the Engineering Requirements for Land Division.

Two government agencies have recently published *What We Heard* reports following respective public consultations on the *Sellicks Beach Growth Area Joint Amendment* and the *Engineering Requirements for Land Division*.

Sellicks Beach Growth Area Joint Amendment



Council considered a report and submission on the Sellicks Beach Growth Area Joint Amendment at its meeting held [14 October 2025](#).

Following the close of community engagement, the Department for Housing and Urban Development (DHUD) have released the Sellicks Beach Growth Area Joint Amendment '[What We Heard Report](#)'.

DHUD received more than 440 submissions, feedback forms and survey responses from landowners, community members, councils, industry bodies, community groups, advocacy organisations and state government agencies.


The key themes of feedback include the natural environment and wildlife/biodiversity corridors being a high priority, as was identifying need for upgrades to infrastructure, particularly wastewater (sewer).

Although the report identifies that the majority of respondents were not very supportive or not supportive at all, DHUD have made it clear that feedback cannot influence whether the Sellicks Beach Growth Area is rezoned for residential development – this area was identified as a growth area

in the 30-Year Plan for Greater Adelaide (2010 and 2017) and Greater Adelaide Regional Plan (2025).

The engagement report will be provided to the Minister for Planning with the updated draft Joint Amendment to enable a final decision.

Engineering Requirements for Land Division



The State Planning Commission (the Commission) prepared the draft Design Standard 1 – Engineering Requirements for Land Division for the purpose of providing technical guidance to deliver consistent design standards, construction specifications and infrastructure costs for land divisions within areas zoned Master Planned Neighbourhood Zone.

Council considered a report and submission on the Engineering Requirements for Land Division at its meeting held 15 July 2025.

We note many of the concerns raised by council’s Technical Services team are identified as the main topics of feedback in the report.

The Commission is currently collating and considering all feedback with further work to be undertaken in response to the feedback regarding aspects of operation and technical details to inform the draft Standard.


