SA Funded Measles Vaccination Program



Due to ongoing measles outbreaks overseas, there has been a recent increase in measles cases across Australia, most commonly in unvaccinated and under-vaccinated adults between 20 to 49 years of age.

The best protection against measles is full vaccination.

In September the SA Funded Measles Vaccination Program expanded to include:

- all adults born during or after 1966 who do not have evidence of receiving two measles vaccines
- children 6 months to less than 12 months of age travelling overseas.

Most people born in Australia before 1966 will have been exposed to the measles virus and therefore do not require vaccination.

Most adults born in Australia between 1966 and 1989 have only had one dose of Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine and require an additional dose. Two doses of a measles containing vaccine are required for best protection against measles.

This expanded program is in addition to the measles vaccines given on the [South Australian Immunisation Schedule](#)

The City of Onkaparinga Immunisation Team will be administering Measles vaccines as part of this expanded program at council immunisation clinics.

The Immunisation Team is also currently working with the Wellbeing Team to offer a worksite Vaccination program offering the measles vaccines to all interested staff at the City of Onkaparinga through the wellbeing program.

Port Stanvac Mixed Use Code Amendment

Planning and Design Code

The Minister for Planning has approved the commencement of public consultation on the Draft Port Stanvac Mixed Use Code Amendment.

This Code Amendment proposes to rezone the former ExxonMobil Port Stanvac refinery (which ceased operations in 2003, to enable the development of a master planned, mixed-use precinct.

The [Greater Adelaide Regional Plan](#) (GARP) identifies Port Stanvac by designating it as a State Significant Infill Area (Urban Renewal Area).

MAB Property Development (MAB / the Proponent) plans to remediate and develop this 230-hectare site into a mixed-use precinct for housing, retail / commercial and employment / innovation uses - the development is expected to deliver approximately 3,600 homes and 60 hectares of employment land.

A coastal reserve will provide responsible public access to the coast to ensure the area's biodiversity remains protected together with completing a missing link in the South Australian metropolitan Coast Park path.

Elected Members will recall two [EM sessions](#) concerning Pt Stanvac held firstly on 11 February 2025 and then more recently on 12 August where MAB and DHUD representatives briefed Council on the Code Amendment.

Engagement

Consultation commenced 22 September 2025 and will run for six weeks with URPS on behalf of MAB Property Development Pty Ltd leading the consultation process.

Council encourages the community to engage in the state Department for Housing and Urban Development's Mixed Use Code Amendment process, via promotion on the City of Onkaparinga's Yoursay page ([Port Stanvac Mixed Use Code Amendment | Your Say Onkaparinga](#)) and social media, which is currently providing information and links to the Joint Amendment.

Residents are also encouraged to lodge a submission direct to DHUD, via [PlanSA portal](#).

URPS have scheduled two community drop-in information sessions. One is proposed on Monday 13 October 2025 at the Gilbert room at Council Noarlunga office from 5pm to 7pm and one on Saturday 18 October at [Karawatha Hall City of Onkaparinga](#) at 11am to 1pm.

Council representatives from Planning and Engagement will also be in attendance at the sessions in the role as a stakeholder/observer.

This year's event is about bringing the whole community together to better understand reconciliation and explore meaningful ways to work it out together in the City of Onkaparinga. We do this by working with community Elders, community members and service groups; Neporendi Aboriginal Forum Incorporated and Neporendi Aboriginal Community Centre staff and volunteers; and with the support of Joining Hands and Minds – a network of local agencies that provide services to the First Nations community.

We also continue to support reconciliation through the delivery of our Reconciliation Action Plan and a range of actions across four key areas – relationships, respect, opportunities and governance. The Reconciliation in the South event was rescheduled after the National Reconciliation Week-aligned event faced inclement weather in May.

National Reconciliation Week (27 May to 3 June) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

Rules Around Tree Removal

Did you know that laws have changed around removing trees from your property?

In May 2024, the state government introduced new regulations that protect trees with a smaller trunk circumference, which means you now need to seek development approval to remove any tree with greater than 1 metre circumference. The changes now mean that a tree with a circumference of at least 1m is considered a "regulated", and at least 2m is considered a "significant" tree.

Meanwhile, the penalties for destroying or removing protected trees have significantly increased – up to \$120,000 for a private person or \$600,000 for a company.

It is vital you know what rules apply when considering whether to remove a tree on your property. These changes were brought in by the state government to better protect Adelaide's urban tree canopy and biodiversity, help cool our suburbs and provide habitat for wildlife.

While this is a big win for the environment and community wellbeing, the changes can lead to hefty unwanted fines for those who don't do their research before removing a tree.

The council regularly prosecutes unauthorised removals of regulated and significant trees. In one recent case, a fine of \$28,000 was applied by the Environment, Resources and Development Court. A development application must be approved to remove a regulated or significant tree. This requires a development application fee and either the planting of replacement trees or contributing to the

state government's Urban Tree Canopy Off-set Scheme. The latter contributes to tree planting and greening elsewhere such as in public parks or reserves.

While the new regulations may take some time getting used to, it pays to be on the safe side when you are considering changes to your property.

By going through the formal development application process, you'll not only be helping to protect Adelaide's under-threat urban tree canopy, but you'll also be protecting your hip pocket. It's also worth carefully considering your reasons for wanting to remove a tree in the first place, taking into account their potential to provide habitat, cool your home and increase your property value.

Rather than removing a tree, you can apply for a council rebate to get 50 per cent off the cost of an initial arborist assessment – including pruning and general management advice – for your regulated or significant tree, up to a maximum of \$150.

The City of Onkaparinga is doing its bit to protect and enhance the region's tree canopy, having planted more than 66,000 trees towards its target of 100,000 trees in street verges, waterways and parks by 2037.

If you're in doubt about whether you can remove a tree from your property, you can contact your local council in the first instance.

JJ Jenner Student Scholarship



Advice to applicants

The Lions Club of Aberfoyle and Districts Incorporated (hereinafter known as The Club) implemented this scholarship programme in recognition of the service and contribution to Lions over many years by Life Member **John Jenner**.

The programme is designed to provide support and recognition for senior secondary students who are to embark on a course of tertiary education. Following are the applicable conditions.

1. The scholarship may be awarded to a person who has successfully completed year 12 /13 studies at a secondary school or educational establishment in 2025, and who is committed to commence a nationally accredited course at a tertiary institution in 2026.
2. Applicants / recipients shall be resident within the service area of The Club, which includes the suburbs of Aberfoyle Park, Chandlers Hill, Clarendon, Coromandel Valley, Craighburn Farm, Flagstaff Hill, Happy Valley, O'Halloran Hill and Reynella East.

3. The \$3,000 Scholarship will be *\$1,000 per annum* and may be awarded for each of three consecutive years of such tertiary study unless determined otherwise by The Club.
4. Continuation of the scholarship will be contingent upon the satisfactory completion of each full year of study. If studies are discontinued, pro-rata reimbursement to The Club may be requested.
5. The possession of another scholarship will not exclude an applicant from being awarded this scholarship.
6. The needs of each applicant shall receive due consideration.
7. Applications will be treated as confidential and will be returned upon request.
8. Short listed applicants will be required to attend a panel interview.
9. The Club reserves the right to determine the conditions of the scholarship and to select the successful applicant(s). All such determinations shall be considered final and no communication with respect to either will be entertained.
