FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS Noarlunga Aquatic Centre refurbishment

What is the City of Onkaparinga planning for the Noarlunga Aquatic Centre?

The planned works include a new roof, support column repairs, the installation of a new main switchboard, a 99kW solar system, a new pool liner, separation of the kids' pool from the main pool, the addition of an accessible ramp, and installation of a new water filtration system.

When will the refurbishment start?

The refurbishment is expected to begin in July 2025.

Why does the centre have to close and how long will it be closed?

The refurbishment will include extensive works that unfortunately cannot be completed while the facility remains open. For much of the refurbishment, the pools will need to be drained to allow work on the pool liner and to eliminate hazards to workers associated with the large body of water.

The refurbishment works could take up to 12 months to complete.

Will the gym and other facilities remain open during the pool shutdown?

Given the extent of the proposed work the whole centre will be closed during the upgrade.

I am a member of the gym. What will happen to my membership?

All current services will remain available until the closure begins in July 2025.

I am a regular user of the pool. What alternative aquatic facilities are available?

We understand this closure may impact your routine.

To assist you, we have put together a list of [alternative aquatic facilities](#) and the services they provide.

We encourage you to contact them early to secure the facilities and services you need.

How much will the refurbishment cost, how much is the council contributing, and will this impact council rates?

The refurbishment is a \$10.8 million project.

In early December 2024, the Hon Catherine King MP and the Hon Amanda Rishworth MP announced that council was successful in our application for \$5.4 million grant funding from the Federal Government through the Thriving Suburbs Program.

At the 10 December 2024 Council meeting, matched funding of \$5.4 million was approved. Council's contribution to the project has been identified in council's budget and Long Term Financial Plan.

What is the current condition of the roof?

The roof has been in place for over 30 years and is showing signs of deterioration. Addressing the deterioration now will ensure safety and longevity of the facility for another 30 years.

How will the roof be repaired?

We will remediate the support columns and replace the roof and ceiling.

Why is a solar system being installed?

The Noarlunga Aquatic Centre is the council's highest energy consumer and greenhouse gas emitter. A 99kW solar system will significantly reduce both energy usage and emissions.

Why does the lagoon pool need to be separated from the main pool?

Separating the lagoon pool from the main pool will improve temperature control and safety for younger swimmers. It will also allow for better maintenance and more efficient operation of the pools.

How will the new pool liner and filtration system benefit users?

New pool tiles or a vinyl lining will maintain the integrity and improve the durability of the pool and reduce the need for costly repairs, while a modern filtration system will use fewer chemicals and energy, improving water quality and sustainability.

Is the current pool filtration system effective?

The current system is aging and while it does treat water to the required standards so the pool is safe to swim in, the new system will provide a higher level of bather comfort, be more efficient, reliable, and cost effective to operate.


Will the refurbishment affect membership fees or pool entry costs?

Membership fees and pool entry costs won't be used to fund upgrades. Fees and charges are considered as part of our annual budget and council will always need to balance operating costs with cost of living pressures on the community.

<p>Happy Valley BMX Club & Cove Bmx Update</p>	<p>At our last Council meeting, we endorsed a motion to support the continued use of the Happy Valley BMX Track by the Happy Valley and Cove BMX Clubs</p> <p>✓ Council noted that no rescission motion was needed, as this matter relates to a decision of the former Council in 2022.</p> <p>📄 We reviewed correspondence between the Cities of Onkaparinga and Marion, along with a formal report by AusCycling, which assessed the track's condition and outlined potential minor works to support rider safety and usability.</p> <p>🔧 What was endorsed?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minor works on and off the track may proceed (at the clubs' expense), subject to landowner consent • Test runs will be allowed to confirm the feasibility of proposed improvements • Our staff will provide in-kind support to the City of Marion on repairs to the Sam Willoughby BMX Facility • Community consultation will be undertaken with nearby residents to assess support for increased use • If no objections are received, the CEO may approve club access in consultation with the site lessee • A traffic management plan and risk analysis will be developed to ensure community and event safety • A final update report will come back to Council in August 2025 <p>Thank you to our clubs, volunteers, members and my co-councillor Cr Geoff Eaton for your support and work towards this outcome. - Services and linings 🔧

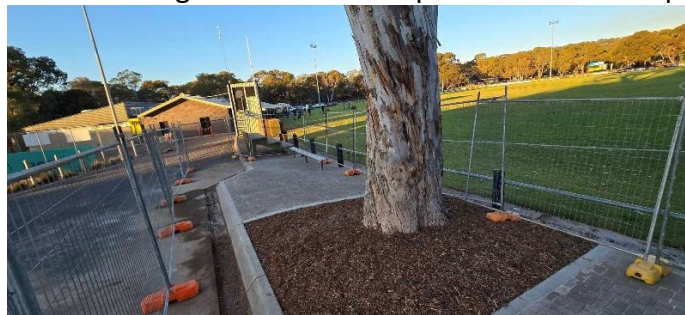
Currently, the project is on track for an official opening in late 2025! 🎉
